Fair Trade Certificate is committed to promoting fair trade practices, ethical standards, and principles in the pursuit of a just and sustainable global economy. These standards aim to guide organizations seeking Fair Trade Certification, ensuring adherence to principles that prioritize social responsibility, environmental sustainability, and ethical business conduct.

1. Social Responsibility:

1.1 Fair Wages:

- Certified entities must ensure that workers receive wages that meet or exceed local minimum wage standards.
- A commitment to providing fair wages that contribute to a decent standard of living for workers and their families.

1.2 Working Conditions:

- The assurance of safe and healthy working conditions for all employees.
- Compliance with international labor standards, including reasonable working hours and the right to organize.

1.3 No Child Labor:

- Strict prohibition of child labor in any stage of production or supply chain.
- Age verification mechanisms and monitoring to ensure compliance.

1.4 Non-Discrimination:

- Equal opportunities for all individuals, irrespective of gender, race, religion, or any other form of discrimination.
- Promotion of diversity and inclusion within the workplace.

2.1 Sustainable Sourcing:

- Encouraging consumers to make informed choices and supporting fair trade awareness.
